

We are Happy to provide the following information on Child Restraint Guidelines for CanaDream RV's.

Please note: There are no specific regulations in Canada requiring additional fixed points specific to child seats in RV's. Nor is there specific legislation dealing with the use of child seats in motorhomes. Child seat regulations for driving cars vary by province in Canada. Our guidelines are based on the most restrictive provincial policy.

We have provided diagrams of each of our units. The green dot represents the fixed tether point location where a child seat can be attached.

In the chart below you will see 3 different types of child seats (for the appropriate age/height/weight of child) and the number of each type of seat which our units can accommodate. When reserving the RV, you can request the rental of a child seat. It is important that you specify which type of child seat you require. We strongly recommend that you pre-book your child seat(s) as availability cannot be guaranteed without prior booking.

If you are making use of our complimentary airport/airport hotel pick up, you will also need to request child seats for the transfer. This can be done at the time of arranging your pick-up time. Note that in Canada there are no regulations for having child seats in taxi or coach services.
